Carle, Eric. *Do You Want To Be My Friend?*

- A mouse searches everywhere for a friend

Fleischman, Paul. *Sidewalk Circus*.

- A young girl watches as the activities across the street become a circus

Hodgrogian, Nonny. *Cool Cat*.

- Cool Cat turns the world around him into a Rousseau-style masterpiece

King, T.T. *Where is the Cake? (also Where is the Cake Now?)*

- Chaos erupts among animals when two pink cakes in silver platters go missing

Lehman, Barbara. *Museum Trip*.

- A boy imagines himself inside exhibits when he goes on a field trip to a museum

Lehman, Barbara. *The Red Book*.

- A magical red book takes readers on a new kind of adventure

McDonnell, Patrick. *South*.

- Mooch the cat helps a bird find its flock, which has flown south for the winter

Pinkney, Jerry. *The Lion and The Mouse*.

- An mouse proves that even small creatures are capable of great deeds

Polhemus, Coleman. *The Crocodile Blues*.

- A man and his cockatoo discover the true nature of an egg they bring home

- Three children go to a park, find some chalk, and draw pictures that come to life
